### **Just in Time for Passover ... The Seder, A New Contemporary Jewish Haggadah Available Nationally**

(Cincinnati, OH – March 17, 2004) On Monday, April 5, 2004, when Jews around the world gather to celebrate Passover, a weeklong holiday commemorating the Jews' exodus from Egyptian bondage; they'll have a new Haggadah (service for the ritual meal) to draw from. For the first time, **The Seder**, a contemporary Jewish Haggadah created by the Ritual and Lifecycle Committee at Cincinnati, Ohio's Congregation Beth Adam is available nationally via Amazon.com.

**The Seder** tells the story of the Jews' freedom from slavery, melding traditional and contemporary liturgy to create a Passover ritual that is meaningful, relevant and appropriate for all ages. The stories and traditions of ancient times are retold in a contemporary way to bring meaning to modern day Jews. This Haggadah, a graphic design award winner, provides direction for beginners and comfort for 'old timers' as they celebrate this meaningful holiday together.
