## Rabbi's Message

### “I have a dream”

There are few among us who don't recognize these words and the man who spoke them. Even if one was young or not yet born when these words were spoken, they are still recognizable. For they have become part of our American history and are taught along with other great American sayings. Jon Meacham, author, biographer and professor, wrote that “with a single phrase, Martin Luther King Jr. joined the ranks of Jefferson and Lincoln — all men who've shaped modern America.”

### “I have a dream”

Spoken on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in front of 250,000 civil rights supporters, King's words inspired and moved those who heard them. But not all were taken by the speech or the march on Washington. There were political leaders who suggested that the African-American community should not be asking for

more — that they should be content with the progress that had already been made. It should be noted that in 1966, a Gallup poll found that only 33% of Americans had positive feelings about MLK. And it has been suggested that more focus was given to the “I have a dream” speech after King's assassination five years later. In his day, neither King, nor his words, were as revered as they are today.

### “I have a dream”

King spoke those words 55 years ago. And since that day, August 28, 1963, they have reverberated across the years. Like all great prophetic voices, King both inspired and challenged. He created a vision with his words of a world we all could imagine, in which all people lived together in peace and unity. And while idealist to be sure, the power and draw of such a world continues to motivate people to act, to work for justice, to push towards equality.

## **"I have a dream"**

Approximately five years after King spoke those words, he was assassinated on April 4, 1968. And while the dreamer was silenced, his dream remained. Those words, once spoken, echoed from Washington across our nation and across the years.

When Robert Kennedy, then seeking to secure the Democratic presidential nomination, heard of Rev. King's death, a campaign stop became a memorial. Kennedy's words, like King's, were powerful and strong. He reminded all of us that "what we need in the United States is not division; what we need in the United States is not hatred; what we need in the United States is not violence or lawlessness, but love and wisdom, and compassion toward one another, and a feeling of justice towards those who still suffer within our country, whether they be white or whether they be black."

And just two months later, on June 5, 1968, Robert Kennedy was gunned down in Los Angeles. Two powerful voices were silenced and our nation was changed. How the course of history would have been different if both men had lived, we will never know. But 1968, will always be remembered as the year King and Kennedy were killed.

With the arrival of 2018, fifty years have passed, and our nation still knows prejudice, distrust, racism, injustice, suffering, anti-Semitism and violence. Regrettably, while King and Kennedy spoke of what our nation could be, we have failed to achieve their vision.

## **"I have a dream"**

While we've not yet realized the dream, what is required of us is to keep working toward it.

2. Each inscription donation will cost \$540.00 and is separate from other donations to the Congregation.
3. Engraving begins once full payment is made.
4. Inscriptions are a total of 100 letters, numbers, and spaces in each dedication space, including the donor's name. English only.
5. Each inscription will be randomly placed in the interest of fairness and spacing.
6. One standardized font has been selected for all inscriptions.
7. Upper and lowercase letters in sentence structure only.
8. There are only a limited number of spaces to be engraved.
9. Beth Adam reserves the right not to accept an inscription if it is thought to be inappropriate for the REFLECTIONS WALL.
10. A request to shorten the inscription may be required due to spacing limitations, and the donor will be consulted prior to engraving.
